1. ABOUT HIT, DRAW, TAP

CurlON launched “Hit, Draw and Tap” (HDT) in the 2015-2016 season. It was such a successful program that Curling Canada took over the program in 2017 and they are sharing it across Canada. “Hit Draw and Tap” is modelled after the NFL’s Punt Kick Pass or Master’s Golf – Drive, Chip, Putt.

Hit Draw Tap (HDT) is a youth skills competition where kids aged 6-12 compete as individuals. HDT will group NB kids into three different age categories (6-7, 8-9 & 10-12), and perform three different shots – a “Hit,” a “Draw” and a “Tap.” The difficulty of the skills are modified based on the age of the child.

Curling clubs across New Brunswick are encouraged to schedule and host a Club HDT competition as part of their Youth Program whenever it best suits them. Based on previous club feedback, we anticipate that each club will need 1.5 to 2 hours to complete their competition. All club competition results (score sheets) must be submitted to the Curling NB Hit, Draw, Tap Coordinator **no later than the date recorded on the Youth Development Events poster** issued to clubs at beginning of season.

All participants will be compared to those in similar age groups from clubs across the province on a “Provincial Leaderboard” that can be accessed online by the public at: www.hitdrawtap.ca. On Saturday of our Spring Little Rocks Jamboree, the top 5 participants from each of the three age categories will qualify to compete in the Hit Draw Tap Provincial Finals.

Participants are responsible for all travel costs to get to and from the event. If a Top 5 participant cannot attend the provincials, his/her spot will be forfeited. Whether or not that spot will be filled will be at the discretion of the Curling NB Hit Draw Tap Coordinator.

Due to the sponsorship of Curling Canada, there will be **no fee** to participate in NB’s 2025 Hit, Draw, Tap Program.

2. ELIGIBILITY

1. The competition is open to all boys and girls ages 6-12. Boys and girls compete against each other, but in their appropriate age categories.
2. As per Curling Canada directives, the three age categories **are based on year of birth**:

- Ages 6-7: Short Game Format
- Ages 8-9: Half Sheet



➤ Ages 10-12: Full Sheet Format

3. All participants may be asked to show proof of age at the Provincial Level of competition.
4. Participants may only enter one club competition.
5. All participants' parent or guardian must complete a Hit, Draw and Tap Participant Registration Form/Assumption of Risk Form. This form is to be provided to their club Hit Draw Tap Coordinator prior to the club HDT competition date.

3. RULES

1. No brushing is allowed during the competition.
2. **Each participant has the choice of using Little Rocks or full-size granite rocks but must throw same at both the club & provincial levels.**
3. Full sheet length and Half sheets are to be used based on details outlined below.
4. Someone (parent, volunteer or other curler) can hold the broom for the thrower.
5. All athletes must abide by the helmet policy while on ice during this event.
6. All participants' parent or guardian must sign the Participant Registration Form/Assumption of Risk Form before participating in any level of Hit, Draw & Tap competition. (club or provincial)
7. Each participant is allowed two practice shots (participant can choose whether they practice draws or hits) prior to their shots being scored.
8. Provincial Finalists will be allowed two practice shots of their choice prior to the beginning of the Provincial Championship.
9. Scores are cumulative per event, with each participant repeating each shot five times.
10. **Ties at the club and provincial level** will be broken to determine 1st, 2nd and 3rd with a "sudden death" draw to the button – draw is repeated until winner is determined. Officials at provincials will measure the distance from the pin to determine the winner if the first tiebreaker draw is unable to determine a winner by score.
11. If at any point a decision cannot be made as to the score of a shot, the decision shall always favour the participant.

4. CLUB REGISTRATION

Curling Clubs are to register their event by e-mail to hitdrawtapnb@gmail.com **on or before the date provided to clubs by the Provincial HDT Coordinator.** The following information is required:

- Name of club
- Name & e-mail address of club HDT coordinator
- Anticipated number of Club HDT participants
- Date club to hold local HDT Day

Registration should be made by the person who will be responsible for the club event. That person will also be required to submit scores of **all** club participants to hitdrawtapnb@gmail.com **no later than the date recorded on the Youth Development Events poster** issued to clubs at beginning of season..
Rebecca will then take all submitted scores and upload them to the Provincial Leaderboard which can be viewed at www.hitdrawtap.ca.



All required Hit Draw Tap information and documents, including this HDT Hosting Guide, can be found at curlingnb.com under PROGRAMS-Youth Development Program:

- Registration/Assumption of Risk Forms (**MUST** be completed & held by Club HDT Coordinator. Provincial coordinator will require finalist's copies when finalists are named.)
- Manual scoring form (to be completed and submitted to Curling NB HDT Coordinator **no later than the date recorded on the Youth Development Events poster** issued to clubs at beginning of season.)

5. HIT, DRAW, TAP CHAMPIONSHIP SKILLS AND SCORING

Pre-Competition Practice

It is recommended that each participant be permitted a maximum of two practice shots or an open practice time – whichever best suits the club. Two practice shots of the participants' choice will be permitted at the Provincial Championship.

Scoring

Each athlete will have five attempts at each shot. The score is cumulative. In all situations, if a score cannot be clearly determined, the decision shall be made in the favor of the participant (i.e. round up to the higher of the two scores).

Game Modification

6-9 year old's shall use half sheet.

6. THE “HIT”

Goal: Hit the rock and stay in the rings.

Scoring	<p>Points are assigned by where the shooter rolls to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• 5 points if it touches the button• 4 points if it rolls but touches the four foot• 3 points if it rolls touches the eight foot• 2 point if it rolls touches the 12 foot	



7. THE “DRAW”

Goal: Draw as close to the pin as possible.



Scoring	<p>Points are assigned by where the shooter stops:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 5 points if it covers the pin 4 points if it touches the button 3 points if it touches the four foot 2 point if it touches the eight foot 1 point if the touches the 12 foot 	<p>Points are assigned by where the shooter stops:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 5 points if it touches the button 4 points if it touches the four foot 3 points if it touches the eight foot 2 point if it touches the twelve foot 1 point if the rock stops in the free guard zone



8. THE “TAP”

Goal: To promote a rock from the 12' to the button.

Set-up	Rock is positioned bisecting the centre line, at the top of the rings.	
Scoring	<p>Points are assigned by where the tapped rock stops:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 5 points if it touches the button • 4 points if it touches the four foot • 3 points if it touches the eight foot • 2 point if it touches the twelve foot • 1 point if contact is made but the rock goes through the rings 	<p>Points are assigned by where the tapped stops:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 5 points if it touches the button • 4 points if it touches the four foot • 3 points if it touches the eight foot • 2 point if it touches the twelve foot • 1 point if contact is made but the rock goes through the rings



9. REPORTING SCORES

Scores are to be recorded on the provided Hit, Draw, Tap Manual Scoresheet for submission to hitdrawtapnb@gmail.com **no later than the date recorded on the Youth Development Events poster issued to clubs at beginning of season.** (Scan & e-mail completed Scoresheets)

10. RECOGNITION AND ADVANCEMENT

Each participant will receive a Participation Certificate. (To be forwarded to Club HDT Coordinator following submission of completed Scoresheets.)

Advancement to Provincials

- The top 5 participants from across the province from each category will qualify to compete in the Hit Draw Tap Provincial Finals taking place during the Spring Little Rocks Jamboree. Participants are responsible for all travel costs to get to and from the event. If a Top 5 participant cannot attend the provincials, his/her spot will be forfeited.
- **On or about four weeks prior to the Provincial Finals, Curing NB Hit, Draw, Tap Coordinator will contact Club Coordinators of the Top 5 participants in each category. Club Coordinators will be required to forward completed Registration/Assumption of Risk Forms of the Top 5 participants and confirmation of each child's availability to attend the Provincial Finals. Forms and confirmation of attendance are to be submitted within 1 week of having received above notice from Hit, Draw, Tap Coordinator. (Scan & e-mail forms to hitdrawtapnb@gmail.com)**
- Parents/Guardians of participants who have qualified and confirmed attendance at provincials will receive an e-mail communication on or about 1 week prior to Provincial Finals with event details.
- All attending Provincial Finalists will receive:
 - o Hit Draw Tap Hoodie
 - o Group Photo (sent via email post-event)
 - o Treat bag
- Top Three in each category will receive keeper award.
